Overview

Eastern Goldfields Education Support Centre is a school for students with mild to severe intellectual disabilities. While this criterion is the primary basis for enrolment, students typically present with a broader range of disabilities including autism spectrum disorder, psychological disorders, physical disability or sensory impairment.

Eastern Goldfields Education Support Centre has firmly established itself within the Goldfields community, earning widespread acceptance and recognition through its rich history dating back to 1946. With the aim of building strong connections, Eastern Goldfields Education Support Centre seeks to engage families, the broader community, and external agencies, fostering collaborative relationships for the benefit of our students.

As a partner school to both Kalgoorlie Boulder Community High School (KBCHS) and Eastern Goldfields College (EGC), Eastern Goldfields Education Support Centre provides high-quality personalised programs with links to the WA Curriculum to meet the diverse and complex needs of student in years 7 to 12 across two campuses to ensure comprehensive educational accessibility.

Our primary campus is located alongside KBCHS where we employ a student-centred approach to drive the development, ongoing implementation and regular review of Individual Education Plans.

Our senior campus is located with EGC in the heart of Kalgoorlie where senior students engage in mixed learning programs as part of our senior pathways.

These programs are purposely designed to provide students with opportunities to further develop and practice workplace skills, community engagement and independent living with access to TAFE, the Goldfields Arts Centre, Kingsbury Park, the adjacent shopping precinct and local community services.

For eligible students, the Public Transport Authority (PTA) provides transportation to Eastern Goldfields Education Support Centre through the School Bus Service for students living in Kalgoorlie-Boulder, Coolgardie, Kambalda and surrounding areas.

To prepare students to be 'Ready for Life' with the skills, understandings, behaviours, and values to help them reach their potential, lead purposeful, happy lives and engage in the community.




OUR BELIEFS

Student numbers increased from 42 students in 2021 to 52 in 2022. The increase is attributed to a larger cohort enrolling for year 7 than students graduating.

PROESSIONAL LEARING

Professional learning is core in enabling staff to improve their practice. It includes five student-free School Development Days, induction programs for staff new to our school and after school meetings. These days are used to improve the capacity of teaching and non-teaching staff in line with school and departmental priorities.

In 2022 all staff attended professional development on Team Teach Training. This course equips our staff with how to deal with challenging behaviours and situations in a positive, restorative manner. All staff additionally attended a series of professional learning with INDIGO equipping them with the knowledge and skills to effectively utilise alternative communication devices and eye gaze technology, for personalized learning experiences for students with diverse communication needs.

Selected staff also attended professional development on Child Protection and Abuse, Gatekeeper Suicide Prevention, and Youth Mental Health First Aid, Keys for Life, Manual Handling and Peg Feeding. Additionally, with the purchase of the new bus, selected staff have updated their licenses to share the driving load.

Professional learning with a leadership focus was attended by the admin staff. With a vision around improvement this PL has informed many of the innovations taking place in the school.

Throughout the year, our students have demonstrated remarkable achievements across academic, social, and personal domains. Students have made significant progress in developing essential life skills, fostering independence, and embracing their unique strengths with a majority of students either Substantially **Achieving and Achieving their Individualised Learning Goals** by the end of the year. In addition to these achievements. it is notable to include that we partnered with central Regional TAFE to deliver a certificate II to pursue a student's post school pathway. This student's bravery and determination created an opportunity for a partnership we are keen to maintain and offer to future senior students. We take immense pride in their accomplishments and celebrate their growth as empowered learners.




FINANCIAL SUMMARY

The information provided in the financial summary includes reporting from 1 January 2022 to 31 December 2022. The school entered 2022 with a cash carry forward of \$301, 881.27


